

Key Chamber Priorities  SB 87 (Caballero) Establishes a \$2.6 billion grant program to provide relief to small businesses and boost their COVID-19 recovery efforts.  SB 727 (Leyva) Holds homebuilders jointly liable for damages and penalties on wage violations for employees for which they have no control. AB 1074 (Gonzalez) Adds new costs onto hotels by forcing them to hire former employees of a contractor when working with a new contractor.  AB 257 (Gonzalez) Strips fast food franchisees of their autonomy by giving franchisors oversight on wages, benefits, and hours in the workplace.  SB 336 (Ochoa Bogh) Requires publication of future COVID-19 orders and creation of an email list to keep businesses informed of any changes.  SB 62 (Durazo) Eliminates piece rate as a method of payment in the garment industry and expanded joint liability for wage claim violations.  AB 701 (Gonzalez) Threatens warehouse operators with duplicative, costly lawsuits due to inconsistent regulations governing employee performance.  SB 95 (Skinner) Requires employers to provide up to 80 hours of COVID-19 paid sick leave for businesses with at least 25 employees.  AB 80 (Burke) Allows up to \$150,000 of expenses paid with Paycheck Protection Program loans to be tax deductible.  AB 1371 (Friedman) Bans the use of many packaging materials while no economically viable alternative exists to sufficiently protect products  AB 1106 (Cervantes) Establishes a pilot program to serve the employment training needs of small businesses and upskill local workers.
